Here is a very rusty inner rear fender from a 1978 Yamaha DT250 that i de-rusted with Metal Rescue. It is Yamaha part # 1R7-21617-00-00 <http://www.boats.net/parts/detail/yamaha/Y-1R7-21617-00-00.html> and as you can see it is no longer available. Here is the pics of the 1978 Yamaha DT250 rear fender after it was soaked about 72 hours in Metal Rescue that was 40% to 50% spent and at about 60 degrees F. This part also has a heavy coat of Boeshield T-9 <http://www.boeshield.com/> the white looking stuff in the center off the bottom is from extra heavy T-9 oily residue.
